



2022 Annual Report for New Mexico Ramp Project, Corp.

Our Vision:

Build access ramps so that no New Mexico resident shall lack safe access to their residence because of financial limitations.

Who We Are:

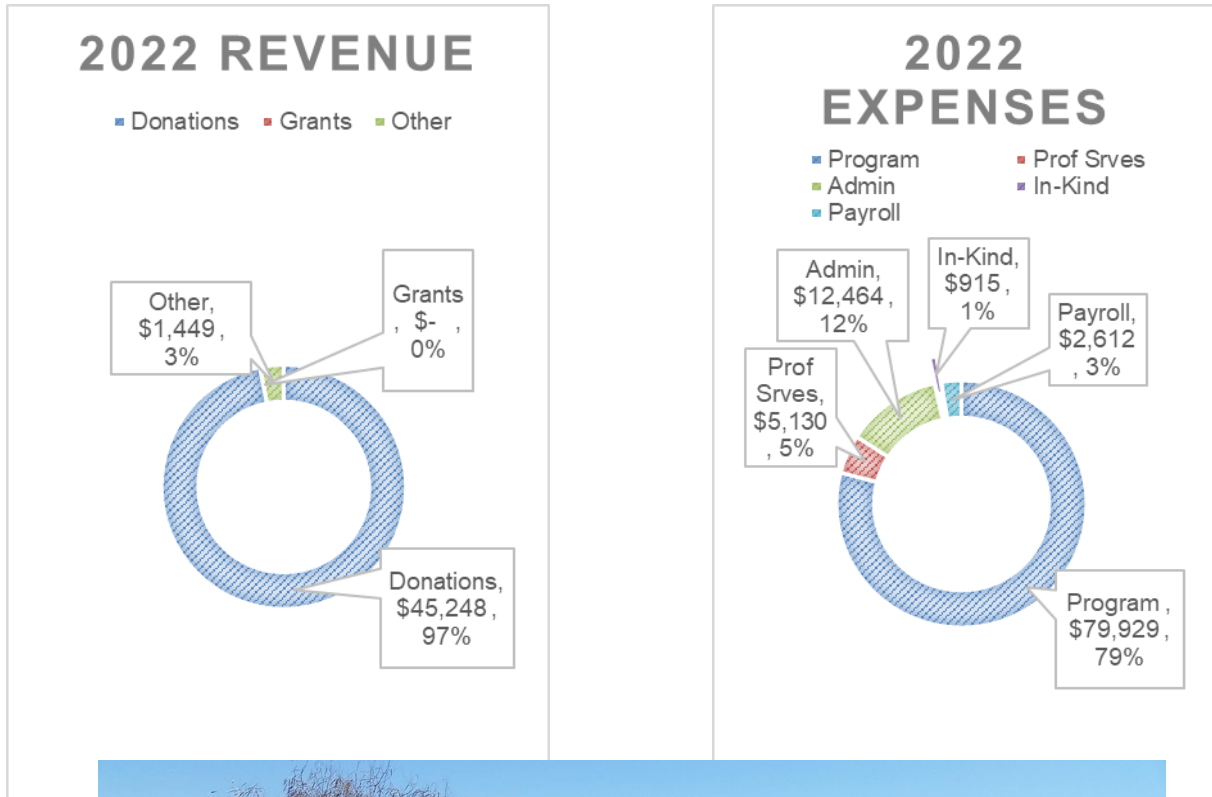
The New Mexico Ramp Project (NMRP) is a 501(c)3 charitable nonprofit corporation that provides ramps at no charge for the residences of people with mobility issues across New Mexico. Recipients are identified by local health care providers and organizations knowing the financial and medical condition of the individual. Ramps are built by volunteer labor and are provided without regard to race, religion, ethnicity, age or gender.

NMRP is making positive changes by giving freedom to those individuals that can now become mobile. This added mobility provides greater independence and longevity while reducing pressures on in home caregivers.



Financial Data:

In 2022 the project carried over \$69,289 from prior year operations with most of those funds coming from grants received before Jan 2022.



2022 Accomplishments:

- ◆ 75 families lives were made better from ramps built by the project using approximately 2,889 hours of volunteer labor both building and supporting administratively..
- ◆ Began work developing program with the Career and Technical Education Center of Hobbs (CTECH), a part of the Hobbs NM Public School System. The program will cover all aspects of the ramp building projects from needs identification, planning, develop volunteers, pre-fabrication, construction, funding, and documentation.

- ◆ Expanded program by working with AmeriCorp National Civilian Community Corps (NCCC) to utilize teams from other states to build ramps. 15 were built in Las Cruces, NM
- ◆ Growth of the NMRP Board of Directors to 11 dedicated, civic-minded members that are key to the success of the NMRP.



Challenges for the Future:

The need for ramps will continue to grow. Challenges to meet this need will be:

- ◆ Increasing funding through grants, financial donations, fundraisers events.
- ◆ Securing a permanent warehouse in Albuquerque for storing materials and building ramp modules.
- ◆ Engaging volunteers statewide to fill positions in the corporate structure and build teams.
- ◆ Developing Team-Leads statewide with a team trainer.
- ◆ Improving communication methods to enhance communications between leadership and volunteers.
- ◆ Reducing times between ramp requests submission and the ramp installation.
- ◆ Improving the system of determining ramp request prioritization to improve response times
